This coming Tuesday, Feb. 19th, is a huge day for Public Education in Austin. BOTH the Senate and House education committees are taking public testimony:

- The Senate starts at 8:30 AM (rm. E1.028). TAMSA's Dineen Majcher, representing the parents' perspective, will participate on a panel to discuss testing, and the committee will take public testimony (2 minutes each).
- The House committee starts at 2:00 PM (rm. E2.036) and will discuss numerous testing bills. They will also take public testimony (4 minutes each).

Parents: come to Austin Tuesday with your children and share your personal experiences with our lawmakers; express your concerns and hopes for a better assessment system for Texas public schools.

TAMSA has heard dismaying reports from communities all over Texas about the limitations state tests have placed upon children and their educational careers. *This may be the only time the Senate takes public testimony on assessments; it's a fantastic opportunity to speak to both the Senate and House in one day.* We realize it's a school day but what better civic experience for young people than to come to the legislature and make a difference!

Let's pack the rooms with Texans who care about what is happening to public education and recognize the waste of time and money spent on testing.
