Dear Spring Branch Speaks Member:

Please see the attached email from TAMSA (Texans Advocating for Meaningful Student Assessment), who are asking for parents and voters to contact Senate leadership THIS MORNING about House Bill 5, which decreases End-of-Course (EOC) tests from 15 to 5 and offers more flexible graduation plans for high school students.

This past Friday, SBISD's Senator Dan Patrick attempted to present HB 5 to the full Senate for a vote. After 6 hours of back room lobbying by the Gov. and Lt. Gov. to add more End-of-Course exams (EOCs) to the bill, the Democratic Senators asked Lt. Gov. Dewhurst to postpone HB 5's hearing until today, Monday, May 6th. We hear the Senate could hear HB 5 first thing this morning, and that Sen. Tommy Williams from The Woodlands intends to offer a BAD amendment that adds more EOCs.

We hope you will add your voice and weigh in on this issue this morning.

Dear TAMSA Members:

REMINDER: Please make the following 4 calls today before 11 AM in support of House Bill 5\* and a limit of 5 EOCs.

1) CALL YOUR SENATOR (click here to find your Senator's number) and ask that he/she:

- Tell Lt. Gov. Dewhurst that HB 5 has to be voted on TODAY, AS IS, with no more than 5 EOCs.
- Vote YES to HB 5 with NO MORE THAN 5 EOCs.
- Vote NO on any amendment that adds more EOCs to HB 5.
- 2) CALL LT. GOV. DEWHURST (512) 463-0001 and ask that he:
  - Allows HB 5 be voted out of the Senate TODAY, AS IS, WITH NO MORE THAN 5 EOCs.
- 3) CALL GOV. PERRY (512) 463-2000 and ask that his office:
  - Stops standing in the way of the Senate hearing HB 5 AS IS.
  - Stops playing politics with our children!
- 4) CALL SEN. WILLIAMS (512) 463-0104 and ask that he:
  - Not offer any amendments that increase the number of EOCs to more than 5, whether mandatory or optional.
