## **Runoff Election Dates:**

Early voting: July 23 - 27, 2012 Election Day: Tuesday, July 31, 2012

IMPORTANT: If you will be out of town between July 23 - 31, you can still participate in the Runoff by mail - simply submit an Application for Ballot by Mail from the Early Voting Clerk in your county of residence or from the Texas Secretary of State. Please note: the application must be received (not postmarked) by July 24<sup>th</sup>. Harris County Voting by Mail applications can be found at http://harrisvotes.org/Docs/app4ballotbymail.pdf

## Key dates to remember:

Last Day to Register to Vote for the Runoff (if you're not already registered): July 2, 2012 Last Day for Harris County/TX Secty. of State to Receive Application for Ballot by Mail: July 24, 2012

## Runoff Voting Rules:

If you voted in the primary election, you must vote in the runoff election by political party affiliation (e.g. Republican primary voters can only vote in the Republican runoff; Democratic primary voters can only vote in the Democratic runoff).

If you did NOT vote in the primary election, then you can vote in either party's runoff election.
