Dear Spring Branch Speaks members:

The debate continues about standardized testing in Texas. Recently, a group out of Austin - calling themselves the "Texas Coalition for a Competitive Workforce" - held a news conference in support of the new STAAR testing system. Their message: they are happy with testing and will oppose any increase in education funding if there are any changes to the current STAAR exams.

These influential Austin voices dismiss the concerns of parents, students, educators, and other professionals from across the state - many of whom testified about concerns with the new STAAR testing system during a recent House Education Committee hearing held on June 19, 2012. Among the many concerns was that the cost of the new STAAR testing system is approaching \$500 million . . . in a time when public education is experiencing deep funding cuts.

TAMSA (Texans Advocating for Meaningful Student Assessment) - a grassroots organization of Texas parents and business owners who support public schools and demand high educational standards - responded by advocating for more meaningful assessments that aid students and districts without wasting valuable instruction time and our significant tax dollars; money that could be used to hire additional teachers and enrich classroom learning. Spring Branch ISD Board of Trustees also recently passed a resolution expressing their concern about the over-emphasis that is occurring with standardized testing in public education
